Celebration of the 79th Independence Day of India

High Commission of India proudly commemorated the 79th Independence Day of India in Wellington with a flag-hoisting ceremony on 15th August, 2025 at the Chancery Premises. The ceremony was attended by members of the Indian and Kiwi community, school children, Persons of Indian Origin, and friends of India who gathered to honour this significant day in India's history.

- 2. The High Commissioner of India Ms Neeta Bhushan, hoisted the tricolour followed by the singing of the National Anthem, "Jana Gana Mana," resonating with pride and unity. High Commissioner read the excerpts from the address of Hon'ble President of India Smt. Droupadi Murmu.
